— RECIPE CORNER —

Spring Rolls with Peanut Sauce

spring roll wrappers
veggies, all julienned: carrot,
cucumber, bell pepper, purple
cabbage
vermicelli noodles, cooked
green leaf lettuce, destemmed
medium cooked shrimp, sliced in
half, length-wise

Peanut Sauce:
1/4 CUP creamy peanut
1 TBSP hoisin sauce
1 TSP soy sauce
1-2 cloves garlic, minced
5-6 TSP warm water
sriracha sauce, optional

1. Pour warm water into a large pan, like a baking tray. You want the pan to be large enough to fully submerge your spring roll wrappers.
2. Dip a spring roll wrapper into the warm water for about 5 seconds. You want the wrapper to be slightly firm - it will soften as you assemble the roll.
3. Place wrapper onto flat work surface, like a large plate or cutting board.
4. Add filling to the bottom center of the wrapper: few slices of carrot, cucumber, bell pepper, cabbage, a small amount of noodles, a thin layer of lettuce, and some shrimp on top.
5. Roll everything up tightly while folding in the sides, like a burrito.
6. Peanut sauce: Combine all ingredients listed under peanut sauce, except for water, into a bowl. Whisk in 1 TBSP water at a time until you've reached desired consistency.

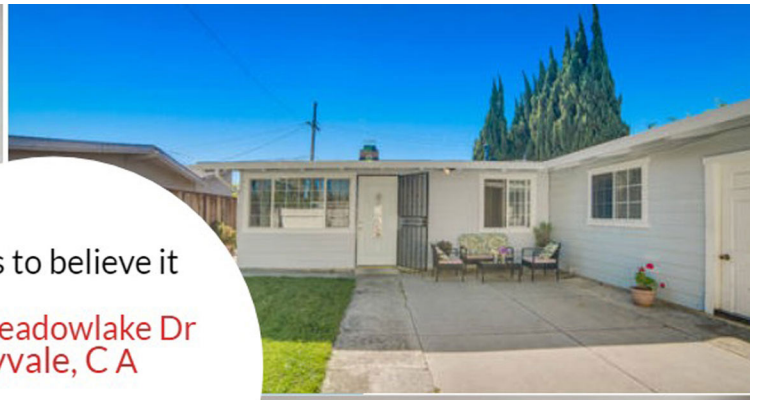
